We would go for dinner together, or watch a movie, and I would take a nap on his couch before I headed back north to home in Peterborough and he would wake me up with sweet Father kisses all over my face. I miss you Dad.....so much....

When I was young, I attended my Dads Karate Tournaments. Later as a young woman, I took Taekwondo. I didn't even realized at the time but I was following his footsteps.

As I matured as a young lady, and Dad had a new wife and children, I could always call him and he would always give me the best advice and encourage me and loved me no matter what I was going through.
