when I met everybody and it was cool just working side by side with people working on a farm it was great I remember Al used to go pick up the bread sometimes for the animals I don't know if he ever picked up the food for the animals I'm not sure he might have he might have I'm not sure it's been so long but they did that whole family was awesome my mother and my step dad knew the whole family and that's how I got to know the family because my stepdad was friends with Eddie and they're all great people I enjoyed working side by side with everybody and again it would have been nice if his son took over but again it's it is a lot of work and a lot of things to do and probably you have to do some paperwork to fill out for the animals and things like that whatever I don't know what was a good business again I miss it I miss everybody that work there again we all work side by side together and we got things done and I felt like we were just one big family even though we're not related I just felt like a big we were part of a big family business a farm business so yeah everybody is like family like brothers and sisters to me that were there again I thought as any as like a father and Al like Uncle Al so anyways I just really miss being on the phone I really do I miss everybody you guys were great people and I do miss the farm so much again I wish his son had taken over and maybe I might still have a job I might not who knows so just want to say sorry al passed and God bless everybody in that family so if you're out there here's a shout out hello it's Lisa just giving you a shout out and sorry you passed it was a great guy from Lisa
