I first met Andrew when he came into my daughter's life about 6 or so years ago, and really only got to know him well in the previous 2 years. Although he and I certainly had our "challenges" with each other, in that 2 years, I got to know this big huge guy with the tough outer shell that hid, in some ways, a vulnerable little boy, but also a man who really only ever wanted to do the right things in life but seemed to always get the short end of the stick.
