Lorraine's life was characterized by her unwavering dedication to her family. She was a loving mother to her children. Lorraine was predeceased by her daughter Tracy Boudreau. She is survived by her daughter Lorrie Jonas and her children Aiden Jonas, Kerry Ann Jonas and Ian Jonas; her son Ernest Boudreau; her daughter Maria Boudreau and her children Sebastian Nash, Kira Nash, and Autumn Nash; She was also loved by Julia Gironi Rayball and Judy Nash Barnum as if they were her own daughters. Throughout her life, Lorraine worked as a housekeeper in various locations, but she took immense pride in her role as "The Lobby Lady" at the Lowell Hilton. Later, she co-owned Ernie's Bookland, selling used books, comics and vinyl records in downtown Lowell. She was a devoted stay-at-home grandmother, caring for her grandchildren and family friends' children every day, allowing her loved ones to work. While this might not have been a paid job for Lorraine, it was her favorite job, because helping her loved ones and being with children was what she loved most. Lorraine Yvonne Boudreau's legacy of love will live on in the hearts of all who were fortunate enough to know her. Her memory will be carried forward by her family, friends, and loved ones, who will forever cherish the moments they shared with her. However, if you are an a**hole who she had no tolerance for, she prefers you forget her.
