Sam was born in Phnom Penh, Cambodia on May 30, 1966 to former Marine General Mr. Sok Sim who passed away during the Killing Field and Mrs. Nou Aun, a great housewife and businesswoman who passed away in Maine, USA. He was the 6th son of their seven children. Sam was a humble, active, hardworking, handsome guy and loved his wife Nina and her family, his parents, and siblings, older brother Sok Sambo, Sok Sambon (deceased), Sok Sambin, Sok Sambath and sister Sok Sovanny (Ros, Sovanny), Sok Sovannaky (Neang, Sovannaky) with all he had. He never ceased to make his family proud with his kindness, compassion of arts/music, he loved to help friends and people all ages/races and his smiles always showed. He was a strong and generous person. Sam arrived in Sanford, Maine, USA as a refugee with his family on November 15, 1980. He attended and graduated from Sanford High School in Maine in 1986. He moved to go to college and work in Lowell in the Summer of 1986. He went to Middlesex Community College and Cambridge College. He graduated with a degree in Liberal Arts Science from Middlesex Community College. In the last thirty years plus, Sam has been a strong advocate for his

Cambodian Community and American/diversity communities alike since 1986. His resumé full of State, City and Non-profit Organization positions that he has been committed to and worked for all these years. He loved to help many people in the communities ranging from Social Services, Lowell Income Housing Project issues, Educated communities on Lead Poisoning, Organized communities involvement, Civic Engagement and voting issues. In the State he volunteered with many non-profit organizations and profit agencies to benefits his Cambodian and Diversity communities a like. His dedication to the communities that he lived in, and worked in and owned his small business in is obvious in the love and respect that the community had for him. His hard work and respect for his works is evident in the accomplishments thru the years. As with all things Sam

did, he gave more than 100% to his career, his families and friendship and most recently became the CEO of the Rising Stars Entertainment where he uses skills and love of arts/music and entertainment to bring famous singer, movie stars, musician from Cambodia and other States in the USA to perform during the big National celebration like Khmer New Year and Water Festival and many more. Sam also owning a Small Business called Universal Immigration Services where he has been an Immigration Consultant, Notary Public, and Constable for more than 20yrs.
